 - o SASI Health Benefit Plan; decided to let go of SASI, and just \$250 FTE pay out to employees.
 - 1. The goal will be to offer employees health insurance in the future, but this seems to be the best choice for the current situation.
 - 2. PC will continue to research options, and give attention to the concern that the health benefit stipend should be used for only health costs.

 - o Kiera will change 3-yr projections, and health benefit stipends.
 - o Budget approved.
